Joyce Lathan Childers readily admits that she came from humble beginnings. But, she's quick to point out, that refers only to material things. "When it came to the important things in life: devoted parents, supportive siblings and a loving home rooted in faith, I had it all in abundance." Yet as a young girl strolling the streets of downtown Great Falls, she vividly recalls standing outside the Merle Norman shop gazing in awe at the

sophisticated displays. "At that time, the farthest my imagination could extend was 'One day I'll have enough money to walk in there and buy something,'" said Childers. So, the thought of owning one was beyond the realm of possibilities.

Based on a referral, Childers contacted the Rock Hill Area SBDC where she met Winthrop Region SBDC Director and Business Consultant Tom George. "I didn't have the best financial track record, so I was anxious about approaching lenders," Childers said. "Tom was generous with his time and knowledge, meeting with me weekly for several months to help me develop a business plan and compile a loan application."

Unfortunately, despite this preparation, Childers did not secure a bank loan. No stranger to obstacles, she was undaunted. "I prayed for God to open doors and relied on Tom for his guidance and encouragement," she said. Eventually her faith was rewarded and she obtained the needed capital to seal.

"In September 2022, when I walked into the shop on my first day as the franchise owner, it was a personal and professional dream come true," Childers said, "and I know that Tom was as proud of that moment as I."

Since taking the helm at Merle Norman of Rock Hill, Childers reports that she's been busier than ever managing the cosmetics studio, boutique and hair salon while continuing to work as a stylist. Her tireless work ethic, combined with a large following of devoted clientele, is paying big dividends. Sales have already increased significantly and are maintaining an upward trajectory.

"Thanks to Tom's recommendations for trimming expenses, my Merle Norman franchise

is currently ranked in the top percentile of 950 nationwide." Childers said she aims to

hold the no.1 spot by the end of 2023 with aspirations of purchasing two more studios
